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Filling and Pressurizing Instructions NON-CARBONATED BEVERAGE BACKPACK

Before and after dispensing beverage the golden rule is;
"Make sure the 3-gallon keg and dispensing hose is clean"

We can't stress this point enough. When the keg is clean, then your product will always retain its original taste.

- 1) Take the **very clean** 3-gallon keg and fill it with your non-carbonated product like juice or coffee, **leaving 2 inches from the top**. Put the lid back in place and make sure the lid is fitted evenly. If not fitted properly air could escape, but this very rarely happens.
- 2) Take the Hand Pump and hook the gray disconnect to the valve on the 3-gallon keg where it says **"IN"**. This means gas or air in.
- 3) Take the keg and place it in the backpack.
- 4) Take the cup dispenser, if purchased and fill it with cups and attach it to the side of the backpack.
- 5) Once the hose has been connected you are ready to dispense. You have also been supplied with a top of the line, dispensing gun. Press the handle to start dispensing. On the gun itself, you will see a little screw with **knurling** on it. This adjusts the flow of the beverage coming out the gun. Play with it until you are happy with the flow of beverage.
- 6) At first, you will need to pump the Hand Pump approximately 15 times. This will pressurize the keg. After that, when you notice that the beverage is dispensing slowly, pump the Hand Pump to add more pressure to the keg. Repeat when needed.

After you are done dispensing the entire 3-gallon keg, you are ready to repeat these steps.

However, before you go to refill the keg, make sure you have released all the pressure out of the keg. This is done very easily by flipping the gray air release valve, which is part of the detachable lid.
